## Innovation Moves ITTF Cadet Challenge Forward

Stand still, you stagnate; innovate, you make progress and innovation is the key to the very successful ITTF Global Junior Programme, a fact clearly illustrated at the ITTF Cadet Challenge to be staged in Tokyo from Monday 19<sup>th</sup> to Sunday 25<sup>th</sup> October 2009.

The number of teams has been reduced from eight to six, which will no doubt intensify the level of competition; there is no "wild card" entry and North America has joined forces with Latin America to form a Pan American outfit. Therefore the line up is Africa, Asia, Europe, Oceania, Pan America and the host nation Japan. Judging by the successes on the ITTF Junior Circuit in recent months, recorded by Japanese players, the crowd in the Tokyo Gymnasium will be thoroughly entertained.

One innovation and there is a second. The singles events are only for players born in 1994 and 1995, a maximum of one per country, the tournament being a qualification event for the Youth Olympic Games in Singapore in 2010; the four boys and top four girls will receive the first four passports to Singapore.

With the very near future in mind, a warm welcome to Tokyo!





Singles events (Youth Olympic Games Qualification tournament) are open to selected players born **between 1 January 1994 and 31 December 1995 and being eligible according to IOC and ITTF rules.**

## 8. ENTRIES:

There will be 5 Continental Teams representing Africa, Asia, Europe, Pan America, Oceania plus Japan as the host team. Each Continental Team selected to participate in the ITTF Cadet Challenge can enter four cadet boys' players, four cadet girls' players, two coaches and one Team Manager. All continental teams MUST be composed of athletes representing four different national associations.

The Team Manager will be responsible for all ITTF communications prior to arrival as well as during the competition. In addition, the Host Association has the right to enter the same number of persons.

## 9. UNIFORMS:

Each Team will have to bring a team uniform to be used during the ITTF Cadet Challenge. The ITTF reserves the right to use part of the back or the front of each playing shirt for printing. A special "With the future in mind" logotype will identify the players in the ITTF Cadet Challenge.

**It is recommended to contact the equipment supplier directly in order to get the ITTF logotype printed on all playing shirts prior to the event.**

**Recommended logo Size: 500 cm<sup>2</sup> – Light gray scale or on gray background.**

Please identify Team Uniforms (brand and colour) at the registration deadline.

## 10. REGISTRATIONS:

Each Continental Association shall identify before 10th September 2009 a Team Manager responsible for all information/communication prior, during and after the event.

The Team Managers responsibilities:

- Communication on the selection of athletes according to the deadline of 10th September
- Seeding of the players of their team
- Team organization such as coordination of travel and team clothings.
- Communications with OC and ITTF

Please fill the annex electronic form and if needed the VISA form and submit to the Global Junior Programme Director with copy to the Tournament Director in order to confirm your participation and to book the necessary rooms for players and accompanying persons.

## 11. FORMAT OF PLAY:

### TEAM EVENTS:

Six (6) participant teams: Africa, Asia, Europe, Oceania, Pan America and Japan.

Team events will be played in two stages. Two groups of three teams in the first stage (round robin system) with the group winners advancing directly to the semi-finals and the second and third in each group playing crossed quarter-final matches to enter into the semi-finals. All positions are to be decided. Format of play is AvsX, BvsY, CvsZ, AvsY and BvsX. All matches best of five games.

### DOUBLES EVENTS:

Twelve (12) pairs. Two per participant team.

Direct knock-out system. All matches best of five games. Each of the continental teams as well as the host (Japan) can enter two pairs per gender.

### SINGLES EVENTS (Youth Olympic Games Qualification Tournament):

Up to twenty one (21) boys and girls. Each continent can enter 4 players in each category (same as for the teams and doubles events), representing four different ITTF affiliated associations. The host association's entry will be restricted to one (1) athlete in respective age category. All participants in the singles events must be eligible to participate in the YOG Singapore 2010 at the time of completing the registration (10<sup>th</sup> September).

The singles events will be played in two stages. Five groups of four or five players in the first stage (round robin system) with the top three players advancing to the main draw of progressive knock-out system (playing for the positions 1 to 15) and the fourth and fifth placed players of each group advancing to play for the positions 16 to 21.

Procedures for the KO stage draw.

- Winner of the group 1 will be **placed** in the position 1 of the main draw
- Winner of the group 2 will be **placed** in the position 16 of the main draw
- Winners of the groups 3-4 will be **drawn** in the positions 8-9
- Winner of the group 5 will be **drawn** in the positions 5-12
- Runners-up in the groups will be **drawn** in to opposite halves of their group winners, in positions 4, 5, 6, 11, 12 and 13 (5 or 12 the non-occupied by winner of group 5)
- Players in third position in the groups will be drawn in to different quarters of winner and runner-up of their respective groups

There will **not be separation by teams or continents**.

**Players finishing on the first 4 positions qualify for the 2010 Youth Olympic Games.**

## 12. SEEDING AND DRAWS:

- The **seeding list for the singles events** will be based on the last available ITTF ranking (October 2009) with inputs from the ITTF ranking committee and officials in charge of ranking.
- The **seeding list for the doubles events** will be based on the addition of points of the two players, considering the above mentioned inputs.
- The **seeding list for the team events** will be done according to the ITTF Computer Team ranking for the participating teams and based also on the on the singles seeding list.
- The **Jury Meeting** will be held on Monday October 19th, at 20:30 hours in the Meeting Room of the Shinjuku Washington Hotel, followed by the **Team Events draw**.
- The **singles first stage draws** and the **doubles draws** will be done on Thursday 22<sup>nd</sup> October at 18:00 hours at the Meeting Room of Tokyo Gymnasium.
- The **singles second stage draws** will be done on Friday 23<sup>rd</sup> October at 20:00 hours at the Meeting Room of Tokyo Gymnasium.

## 18. VISA REQUIREMENTS:

Participants must ensure to get the visa prior to the departure to Japan.
